MSB requires that the contact person for incident reporting shall be employed by the operator of essential services and that the email address for the contact person must be their official office email.

PTS information on processing of personal data

PTS processes the following personal data about you: name, e-mail address, telephone number, and mobile telephone number.

The purpose of personal data processing is to ensure that PTS has access to contact details to persons in the notified business, which is necessary for PTS to be able to effectively conduct supervision and investigations. The legal basis for personal data processing is therefore the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority.

The personal data you provide to PTS are kept in accordance with the Archives Act.

- If you want to change, add or delete data about yourself, contact PTS.
- If you want to know what information is stored about you, contact PTS.
- If you want to complain about the processing of your personal data, please contact PTS and also to the Swedish Data Protection Authority.

Since PTS is a government agency, the authority is subject to the right of public access to information. This means that documents of the authority, including personal data, may become official documents that may be disclosed to the person requesting it.
